Our Curriculum

Maths:

EYFS:

The children will be starting the term by looking at mass and capacity. The children will be using balancing scales and containers to explore. We will be investigating how we can balance the scales and which side is heavier or lighter. We will also be experimenting with containers of different shapes to see if the capacity is the same.

The children will then move on to looking into extending their counting and understanding of the numbers 6, 7 and 8. During this topic, we will also be learning about doubling, finding pairs and conceptual subitising.

The children will finish the term by exploring length, height and time. We will be comparing heights and lengths using concrete resources such as ribbons and string. We will also be comparing different times of the day and which tasks you complete at what point in the day.

Year 1 and 2:

The children are going to start the term by looking at formal methods for multiplication and division. They will start by exploring how to count in 2s, 3s, 5s, and 10s. Alongside this, the

children will be exploring how to group and share objects to begin to multiply and divide. The children will then move on to looking at learning techniques to calculate answers to multiplication and division questions including creating arrays.

The children will then move on to looking at length and height. The children within Year 1 and 2 will be measuring in centimetres and metres, comparing and ordering height and length and using the four operations with lengths and heights.

Times tables:

This year, we will continue to focus on times tables. It was a government expectation that by the end of Year 2, all children should know their times table and division facts for the 2, 3, 5 and 10 times tables. To continue to support the children with their times tables they will be singing songs and doing times table focused activities as part of their Maths lessons.

Throughout the year, the children will continue to be tested on their times tables to further boost/secure their knowledge and also give them an opportunity to earn their times tables certificates.

English:

EYFS:

This term EYFS will be looking at the topic People Who Help Us. As part of this topic, we will be reading books about fictional and real-life superheroes. This term we will be recapping identifying initial sounds to begin spell a word. The children will also be writing CVC words and building up to writing short captions towards the end of the term.

Year 1 and 2:

This term the children are writing with the purpose to inform. They will start by writing a set of instructions to build the perfect castle for the King. The instructions will include imperative verbs, concentrating on punctuating sentences correctly and other features that

we have been learning about in Year 1 and 2. They will then write two recipes designing both a main meal and dessert for a king.

Phonics:

Phonics lessons will take place twice a day for all children within the class. The children will be learning new sounds along with consolidating and recapping old sounds.

Spelling Shed:

To help develop the children's spelling, we use Spelling Shed. This program has fantastic games/resources to help the children practice their weekly spellings. Weekly spellings are set for children in Year 1 and 2. The children will be given assignments every week based on a spelling rule and will then be tested in class on that rule the following week.

Science

In Science the children will be building on their knowledge of animals including humans. During this unit of work, children will continue to learn about the basic needs that all animals and humans need to survive. They will study more closely the importance of exercise and a healthy diet. They will also be looking at the offspring of different animals and how they develop and change into adults as they grow.

History:

Our History top for this term is Britain since 1066. The children will be exploring how the history of the UK has been developed by the Normans in 1066 and the subsequent change to life in towns and villages. The children will investigate our local links to King John and his lost treasure.

Y1 Peterborough Museum Visit

Year 1 will be visiting Peterborough Museum this term and becoming Palaeontologists for the day. This trip will be prior learning for their Mary Anning History unit next year. The children will be unearthing real fossils and will be investigating what these fossils can tell us about life millions of years ago. We will also be exploring what these fossils can tell us about the people who found us. This will be followed up by a Jurassic Craft session.

Homework

Homework will be set on a Friday and is due in the following Wednesday. The homework is always fully explained to the children and often recaps things they have been learning in class. The children will be sent home with a copy of the pick and mix grid which has the homework for the term on (this is also available on the school's website). Water Bottles
